
But springtime is no fairytale for frail newborns and orphans. Without big hearts to comfort and protect them, the littlest kittens will be lost.


Thanks to you, we can say "yes" to all the newborns, orphans, and at-risk kittens who need us. As you can see in this chart, that need keeps rising.

BEHAVIOR CORNER

Setting Your New Kitten Up for Success

When you welcome home a kitten (or even better, a darling duo), you're anxious to do everything right. You love your tiny bundle of fur so much, you would do anything for them. Fortunately, there are reliable tips to set them on the path to a lifetime of happiness.

I like to think of three different areas to focus on with new kittens:

 Acclimation: It's crucial to start your new kitten in a single room or smaller space (such as a playpen) to help them adjust to their new home. Giving a kitten too much space too



soon can make them unsure of their new surroundings. By utilizing a smaller space, you can slowly introduce your kitten to their home and make sure they feel comfortable exploring. This helps ensure your kitten knows where to find their food, water, and litter box. Once you let your kitten explore more space, you may need to add more litter boxes. Kittens have small bladders, and when they need to go, they need quick access to a litter box to reinforce good habits.

2. Enrichment: Kittens have boundless energy! There's no better enrichment than another kitten, so they have someone to play with 'round the clock. Cat trees and scratchers will help keep your kitten from getting bored (and into trouble). Wand toys are an amazing tool, as they provide an extension of your arm so that your kitten does not view your hand as a toy. Motorized toys can keep your kitten

occupied when you can't play with them.

3. Socialization: Young kittens are very receptive to training. If a kitten starts to nip or grab at your hand, walk away for a couple minutes. This teaches the kitten they will lose your attention if they perform this inappropriate behavior. Kittenhood is also a perfect time to get little ones used to handling for nail trimming and vet visits. When your kitten is calm and resting, touch their paws to get them used to it. Encourage visitors to spend time with your kitten, so they do not feel afraid of strangers.

Taking home a kitten may seem overwhelming at first. But with timetested wisdom and unconditional love, the best is yet to come for both of you!

not know what to do.

Then came the lullaby of soft voices and warm hands. The orphan was found. But a day-old kitten is as fragile as a butterfly, and Camilla's melody was faint.


Might there be room for one more in the band?


We knew the facts. All evidence
