
<u>Your love</u> is an unbreakable lifeline for residents like Berry. Our merry

#### Subtle Signs Your Cat is Sick

You know you should take your cat to a veterinarian for symptoms like vomiting or lack of appetite. But cats are notorious about hiding sickness, and the earliest signs may appear as behavioral issues. For this reason, we

Affectionate Tootsie would never

turn away attention ... except when she wasn't feeling well. A friendly cat acting shy is often an early sign of medical distress. always recommend a vet check-up if your cat's behavior changes.

For instance...

- Has your cat started growling when you pick them up? They may be feeling discomfort or pain.
- Have you noticed your cat overgrooming, especially by their joints? They may, again, be licking the area in an effort to relieve pain or discomfort.
- Is your cat suddenly having accidents outside of the litter box? They could have a urinary tract infection.
- Do they no longer want to romp with their best buddy? They might not be feeling well and lack the energy or desire to play.
- Are they sleeping all day, or in unusual spots? This might be a

sign that they are feeling unwell and do not want to be around the usual activity in the home.

It's never the wrong call to take your cat to the vet if you notice a change in behavior. In fact, it's an act of love. You might catch an issue early on, which could lead to more successful treatment.

When in doubt, get them checked out!

She would quickly relent and sit demurely, welcoming good scritches and conversation.

There was something tender about Puff, and I wanted to protect her. Unfortunately, the universe didn't ask what



I wanted, and she began to fade. A sudden decline is not uncommon in FeLV+ cats, but with supportive care, they sometimes recover. This was not to be for dear Puff.

Puff lived with grace and delicacy. I can still see her sitting there, somehow both solid and ineffable. My memory of her is enduring, and I will always miss my friend. RIP, baby girl.


But in the throes of illness, Farley never lost hope. Though he could barely lift his head, he smiled into the loving eyes that encircled him.
